If your year of registration is an even numbered year, you must submit at the end of an even numbered year. If your year of registration is an odd numbered year, submit at the end of an odd numbered year. For example; date registration 1995 CE record due 2009; year of registration 2008 CE record due 2010.

Proof of attendance must be provided. If you have not received a receipt, it is your responsibility to obtain verification of attendance. Failure to provide proof of attendance could result in a variance of your submission total. List and attach functions in chronological order, and include only those functions that fall within your credit period.

C.E. Credits can be obtained as follows:

Conference/Regional Symposiums: Five (5) credits per full day for a major educational conference as approved by the Registrar (e.g. O.A.V.T., O.V.M.A., C.A.L.A.S., N.A.V.T.A., etc.).

Conference Speaking Engagements: Four (4) credits per topic, in which you are the speaker, related to the Animal Health field.

Published Articles: Two (2) credits for submission of an educational article to the O.A.V.T. Technews. Two (2) credits for each article of quiz published in the O.A.V.T. Technews or any other newsletter.

Public Education: One (1) credit per hour, maximum of five (5) credit per day, for each speaking engagement, public education engagement, that promotes the Animal Health field (e.g. educational luncheon lectures).

C.E. Quizzes: One (1) credit for each C.E. Quiz submitted and successfully completed to the appropriate agency. These may include the Technews, Veterinary Technician, C.A.L.A.S. Newsletter, or other publications approved by the Registrar.

Courses: a) 10 credits Veterinary Specific course (University or College level)
b) 2 1/2 credits, per course, per year **Non-Veterinary Specific courses
c) Correspondence—at the discretion of the O.A.V.T.

***Note: Non-Veterinary Specific courses may only account for a maximum of 25% of five of the minimum required 20 C.E. credits.*

On-Line CE: As pre-approved at the discretion of the Registrar. (Contact supplier to apply for C.E. credit value).

Other: All submissions will be reviewed and value, if not predetermined, will be determined at the discretion of the Registrar.
